The University Facilities Planning Board met at the Facilities Meeting Quonset beginning at 3:30 pm to discuss the following:

ITEM No. 1 - APPROVAL OF MEETING NOTES

Kurt Blunck moved to approve the draft notes from September 6, 2016. Tom Stump seconded the motion. The meeting notes were approved unanimously.

ITEM No. 4 – RECOMMENDATION – Skyline Bus Stop at Roskie

Candace Mastel presented a map and details about the relocation of Skyline bus stop currently on South 7th Avenue to Roskie Hall parking lot. David Kack and Mastel addressed a variety of questions and comments about the location with the key points being: if approved the bus would enter the lot at South 19th Avenue and exit onto Lincoln Street; safety issues of placing the stop in front of the residence hall; moving the stop east may interfere with the dumpster pickup schedule; consider moving the stop farther east so it is more visible; three of four pickup times are during classes therefore the parking lot will be busy; east parking lot does not empty on weekends.

Existing passengers will be informed of the change on the website and a sign about a change in the pickup location will be placed at the current location.

Mike Everts asked if other locations were considered. Kack said other sites considered include further south on South 7th Avenue near the police station, Harrison Street closer to Langford Hall, and in front of the SUB. However, Karst Stage does not want to place Skyline pickups at the SUB because that location is already too busy with Streamline stops.

ASMSU suggested adding two stops because of the distance to walk from Langford Hall to bus stop with ski gear.

Tom Stump moved to approve a one-year placement of the Skyline Bus Stop at Roskie Hall with the caveat we talk to student life on the specific location and perform an evaluation of the placement after the peak season. Kurt Blunck seconded the motion. The approval passed affirmatively.

ITEM No. 5 - DISCUSSION - Romney Gym Update

Walt Banziger presented an update on the Romney Renovation project. Over the summer President Cruzado said she would like to advance this project so to shave a year off it. The change was approved and the design process began about a month ago. The current draft program project will provide 950 more classroom seats, Veteran/Disability reentry space, a writing center, and a math center. Banziger presented photos to show the layout for all four levels with the third level including an innovative 312 seat classroom "in the round" on the third floor with the possibility of retractable seating, allowing it to be adaptable for other uses, also included was an overlook on the fourth floor. The executive and work committees will review the design next week and be presented to President Cruzado on October 7th.

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This meeting was adjourned at 4:40pm.

STAFF COMMENTS:

What if the new parking garage could be used to transform a very ordinary experience of arriving, parking, and moving on to your next campus destination into a "showcase of how MSU students and faculty have discovered ways to integrate creativity and innovation into even the most everyday of environments." This proposal, recently brought forward by Dr. Royce Smith, Dean, College of Arts and Architecture, envisions a creative display of interdisciplinary work between artists, designers, musicians, architectural and engineering students, and faculty throughout the surfaces and spaces of the parking garage, played out in paintings, graphics, three dimensional surfaces, sound, and/or electronic display.

While still in concept, we are aware of the following:

1. The garage could/should be considered as an extension of instructional space, providing a place or space for students and/or faculty to display their work.

- 2. Funding strategies have not been determined but are in discussion.
- 3. There could be some expectation to have something in place for the opening of the garage in January 2017.
- 4. It is acceptable for the installations to be considered as temporary, i.e. the work will change over time, or can be removed when no longer applicable.
- 5. Some work may be commissioned.
- 6. It is anticipated that art openings or unveilings of new work could happen.



STAFF COMMENTS:

The Telecommunications Antenna Committee reviewed an application and construction drawings from Verizon Wireless to expand the capacity of their existing Macro Cell Site on Leon Johnson Hall because it is nearing its capacity and to target campus locations with large amounts of users. They will utilize a new technology called Small Cell for four locations: Brick Breeden Fieldhouse, Centennial Mall, Miller Dining Hall, AJM Johnson Hall. Verizon Wireless informs MSU that their company has 70 to 80% of the cellular market in Montana and they constantly need to expand capacity and the newest technology to serve their customers. MSU has a large set of customers on our campus using their hand-held devices for voice, Internet, texting, and video. There have been reports of blocking from users. The application was approved by the Telecommunications Antenna Committee for UFPB recommendation to the President for approval.

Application Information

These four small cell sites will be used to enhance localized capacity and coverage, allowing for the availability of 4G LTE coverage to customers in challenging coverage areas. They will also reduce the load for the macro site located on Leon Johnson Hall allowing it to provide improved service across campus.

- Brick Breeden Fieldhouse Antennas are proposed to be mounted on the exterior of the west side of the building and onto the underside of an interior catwalk. An equipment cabinet is proposed to be placed in a space near the press box.
- Centennial Mall The proposed installation will replace an existing light pole with one that is structurally capable to hold a canister antenna above the light, located in the Hamilton Hall parking lot. An equipment box will be placed on the pole, high enough so the public cannot reach it, but it can be reached by a technician on a five-foot step ladder.
- Miller Dining Hall The proposed installation will replace an existing light pole with one that is structurally capable to hold a canister antenna above the light, located at the rear of Miller Dining Hall (west side next to dumpster). An equipment box will be placed on the pole, high enough so the public cannot reach it, but it can be reached by a technician on a five-foot step ladder.
- AJM Johnson Hall The proposed installation will replace an existing light pole with a matching one that is structurally capable to hold a canister antenna above the light, located south of the building. An equipment box will be placed on the pole, high enough so the public cannot reach it, but it can be reached by a technician on a five-foot step ladder.

The equipment consists of small sized antennas and equipment boxes. Coax cable will run from the antenna to the equipment box on the pole, and in the Fieldhouse press box. Equipment boxes will have electricity run from existing building electrical panels. Fiber optic cable will run from the boxes to the underground MSU Utility Tunnel, and over to Leon Johnson Hall where Verizon has its equipment room in the penthouse of the building.

All proposed antennas use the same frequency as the macro site on Leon Johnson, which is licensed. A previously submitted frequency study shows no interference with other frequencies on campus. Construction drawings were prepared by local engineering firm, Allied Engineering, in consultation with MSU staff. Construction will occur as soon as SHPO approves the Verizon application and will be coordinated between CPDC Project Manager and Verizon's contractors. All costs will be paid by Verizon Wireless.

STAFF COMMENTS:

Establishing a universal building abbreviation list has been an ongoing discussion over the past five years. A working group assembled in 2012 to assess the issues and develop a plan for a universal building abbreviation list.

By January, 2014 the group added members and as a Task Group discussed all aspects of building abbreviations – including compiling data on where abbreviations are used, how abbreviations were/are determined, comparing data platform constraints, as well as historical and campus culture considerations. The Task Group – consisted of representatives from Facilities Services, Campus Planning, Design & Construction, Registrar's Office, University Communications, Auxiliaries Services and ITC. Input was sought from University Police, Web and Digital Communications, Res Life and Family Graduate Housing and Telephone Services throughout the process.

The initial task for the group was to compile all the abbreviations lists. This was a helpful demonstration of the variety of abbreviations and their database constraints. The group looked at newer technology opportunities in comparing methodologies for assigning abbreviations. The opportunity was to also assign an abbreviation to every building on campus and not just the major buildings.

Some abbreviations were selected by an individual department that needed to use abbreviations and it was based on their individual constraints and familiarity of the building and not an established formula or methodology. Each major academic building had a two-letter abbreviation in the phone directory and a significantly different three of four-letter abbreviation in the Registrar's course catalog.

Recently, Facilities Services has been implementing phases of a Computerized Maintenance Management System - CMMS using Asset Works, AiM. The building profiles include a designated cell for the building abbreviation. These data are required now in the implementation process and will assist future processes by enabling building references by its complete name, building number or abbreviation.

The Task Group evaluated several methodologies or rules for setting abbreviations and then the necessary rule-exceptions. The character space increased for some data bases and so the resulting abbreviations list was recommended by the Task Group and applied to the collection of MSU buildings is:

- The Maximum abbreviations is six (6) characters.
- Abbreviations can be a combination of alpha and numeric characters.
- If the building name (functional use name or dedicated name) is one to two-word name use the first six letters of the two words combined.
- If a three or more-word name use the first letter of each word. This allowed for an exception for the biosciences buildings that are known by ABB (Animal Bioscience Building), CBB (Chemistry Biochemistry Building), MBB (Molecular Bioscience Building), etc.
- And compounds or complexes (primarily housing and Facilities Services) use abbreviations that begin with the same alpha characters (i.e. East Julia Martin Apartments all begin with EJM and include numeric characters for each individual unit).
- Campus Planning, Design & Construction will maintain the original database and will apply the
 methodology and disseminate any new abbreviations for new buildings and name dedications of
 existing buildings.

Having a universal abbreviation list will require updates to databases, records and maps. These updates will require resources and impact operations using these data such as Phone Services, ITC and Registrar who use Banner for data base data but also codify equipment and locations within buildings; Mail Services and Safety and Risk Management, as well as State operations in Helena; Web and Digital Web Communications, and Auxiliaries Services. But have indicated they will update as they have resources and will direct all furute4r abbreviations use to the universal data available on the MSU web site. University Police use a full name of buildings. CPDC's website for building floor plans and maps already uses this building abbreviation list.

On September 6, 2016 The eight-member Task Group reviewed every building and proposed abbreviations and exceptions. The Task Group unanimously supports the resulting abbreviation list and feels its application will provide more intuitive abbreviations directing new students/faculty/staff, visitors and emergency responders to correct locations.
