The University Facilities Planning Board met at the Facilities Meeting Quonset beginning at 3:30 pm to discuss the following:

#### ITEM No. 4 - RECOMMENDATION Barnard Hall Computer Science's Office & Breakout Space

Aaron Britton presented the recommended furniture installation in Barnard Hall 3<sup>rd</sup> floor breakout space, near the Computer Science's department. The project will include upgrading the hallway breakout space by Barnard Hall 350 with three tables and new glass writing boards. The second part of this upgrade would be adding eight Sedia System seats with JumpSeat profile along the hallway wall to allow more student break out room while they await advising. The JumpSeat attaches to the floor and can fold back up to create more space when the seat is not in use. The eight seats will cost about \$5000. Two of the three tables are café height size, and the third is a standard height size.

Chris Fastnow expressed concern that the JumpSeats may not last long. Britton confirmed that the JumpSeat has been out for about four to five years so far, and there have not been any issues. Jeff Butler was concerned the proposed tables in the collision space at the end of the hallway may not be maintained. It was noted they should watch if the furniture stays in place, or impacts the ability to walk in the hallway. The group decided to check on how the furniture is holding up, after a year of use.

It was suggested we consider this seating for all floors in Barnard Hall, if costs permit. Britton noted that this is an opportunity to try this out and see if it works. If it does, then we can install the system on the other floors in the building in the future.

Fastnow moved to approve the installation of new furniture on the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor of Barnard Hall, Jeff Butler seconded. The motion was approved unanimously.


# **VICINITY MAP:**



#### **STAFF COMMENTS:**

ASMSU has requested a site to locate a synthetic turf field, field lighting, and a one-story, 3500 sq. ft. support building to accommodate the growing demand of play fields by intramural and club sports teams. A synthetic turf field, with lights, will extend the use of play fields deeper into the shoulder seasons and into the evening hours creating longer blocks of time for team play. Reference UFPB meeting notes (ref: Dec. 13, 2016, Item No. 6) for discussions regarding four potential sites.

The Lambert Field site is presented for recommendation for one rugby-sized field (with future expansion of a second field) with field lighting and a support building for team changing rooms, restrooms, and storage. The final location of the fields and building will be determined later in the design process.




# **VICINITY MAP:**



## **STAFF COMMENTS:**

The Tietz Hall Engineered Systems Replacement will include the addition of a new ground level electrical transformer and new exhaust fans on the penthouse roof. The following drawings and photographs provide a "before and after" view of the transformer and roof-mounted exhaust fan locations respectively, per the 95% Construction Documents.

- The transformer location has been carefully studied to determine the least impact to landscaping.
- Exhaust air has always been discharged in this area, and design increases the amount of outside air to the rooms, so it is expected to have a lower concentration of any odors than may have been observed previously.
- Sound attenuation is designed in the system.
